Initiatives are always in response to individual and group needs and interests and are planned with and by young people to assert their values, identify goals and reach their potential.

Limerick Youth Service embraces the need to be proactive in raising awareness around diversity and ethnicity and to ensure all young people are equally welcome and valued.

We are proud to work in partnership with a range of Statutory, Voluntary and community groups and will honour the belief held in us by our financial and other partners in ensuring that Limerick Youth Service is the voice of young people in our City and County.

Limerick Youth Service continues to value volunteers as the backbone of the Organisation and we salute them for their energy, dedication and perseverance in roles ranging from youth club leaders, and advisory group members to governing the Organisation on its voluntary board.
